- Two-seat sofa design adaptation by Charlotte Perriand, 1978

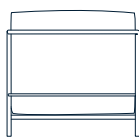
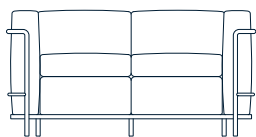

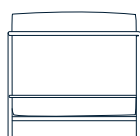
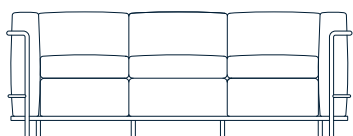


### 2-Seat Sofa
